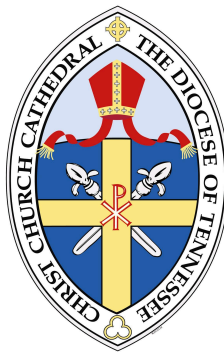

Dr. Peter Rogahn is the Associate Organist and Choirmaster at Christ Church Cathedral, working with Dr. Michael Velting, Canon for Music, in organ playing, choral conducting, chorister training, and program administration. Previously, he served at First Presbyterian Church of Nashville and Bethlehem Lutheran Church in Indianapolis. Passionate about music education, Dr. Rogahn has worked with numerous choirs and spent four years assisting in music instruction at Lawrence North High School. He teaches organ at Belmont University and Lipscomb University and is actively involved in the Nashville Chapter of the American Guild of Organists, serving as Past Dean. Dr. Rogahn holds a Doctor of Music in Organ Performance from Indiana University, where he also earned a Performer Diploma and a Master of Music.
